

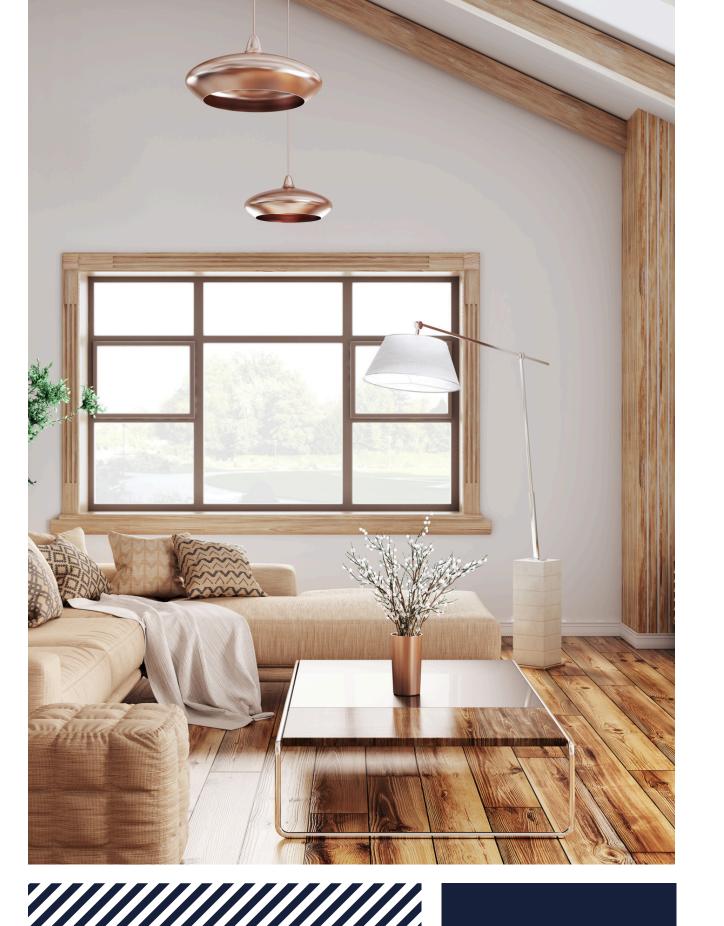

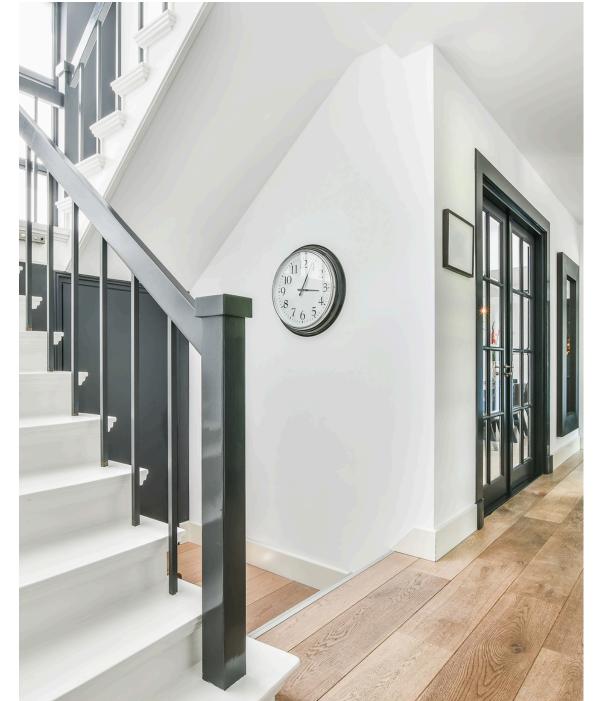

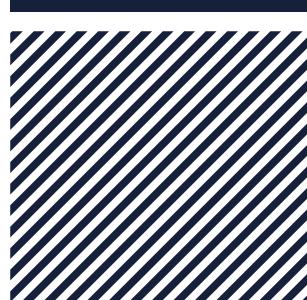
Comparative Market Analysis

Photos

The photoshoot of your home is the most important part of the preparation process, because great photos help sell houses. De-Personalize

Family Photos

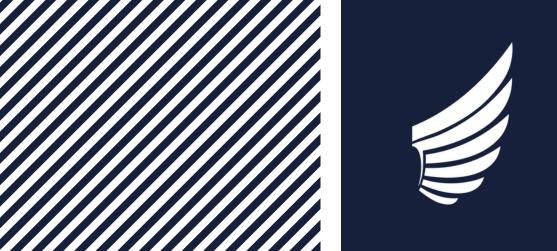
Remove pictures of your family.

Conceal signs of any pets such as crates, toys or bowls.

Try to hide children's items as much as possible.

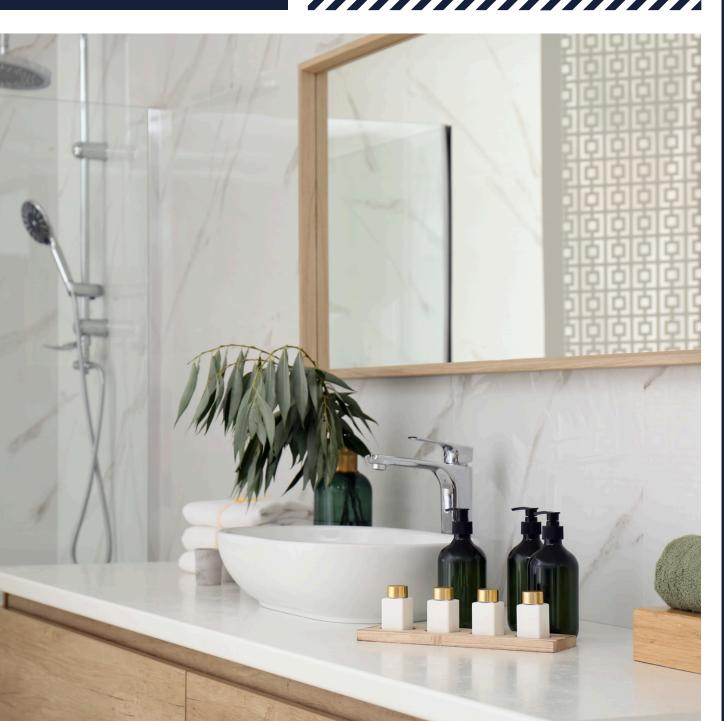
Remove military or sports memorabilia.











Bath Items

Remove items off the bathroom counters, and store them nicely in boxes under the counter or in drawers.

Keep the trash cans empty.

Make sure toilet lids are down.

Favorite Items

If there are certain items that look like they may transfer with the home, make sure you remove them.

You don't want a sale to be held up over window treatments or a chandelier.

Be sure to keep track of valuable items that may not transfer with the home if they show up in photos.





Organize & De-Clutter







Surfaces

Your kitchen counters, top and side of your refrigerator, island, desks, coffee tables and nightstands should all be cleared off.

Leave no more than 3 items on your kitchen countertops.

Hide loose papers and your mail.

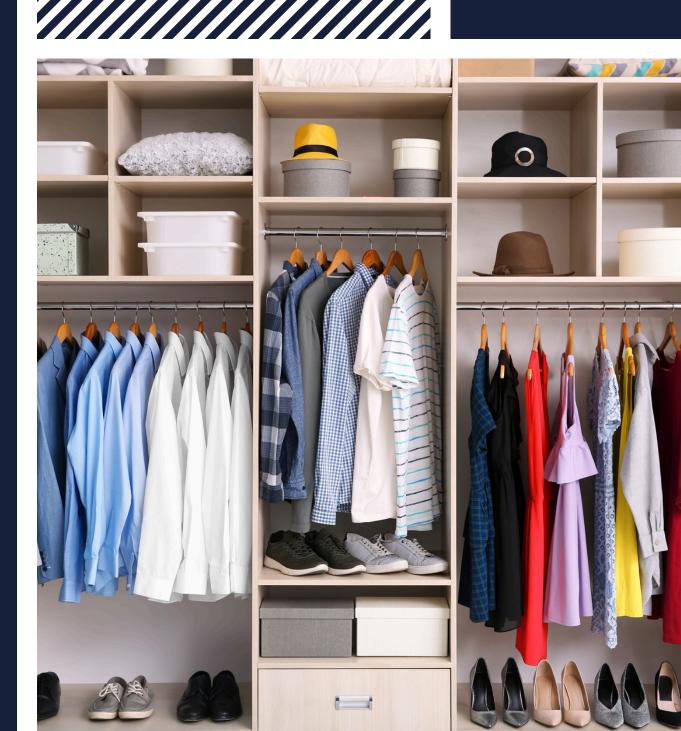
Closets

Organize your closets and hang everything in the same direction.

Move out-of-season outfits to create the appearance there is more space.

Picture Perfect

Organize shelves, collections, display cabinets and tables.

Neatly arrange items in your kitchen and bathroom cabinets and closets.

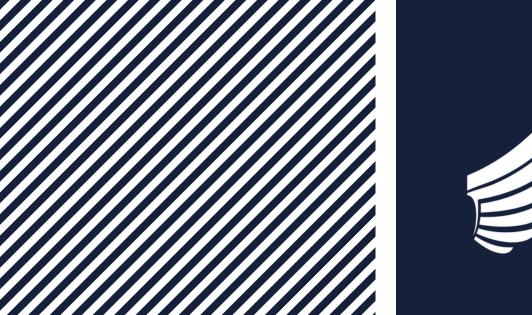
Plan for potential buyers to open up everything!

Technology

Dust off all electronics.







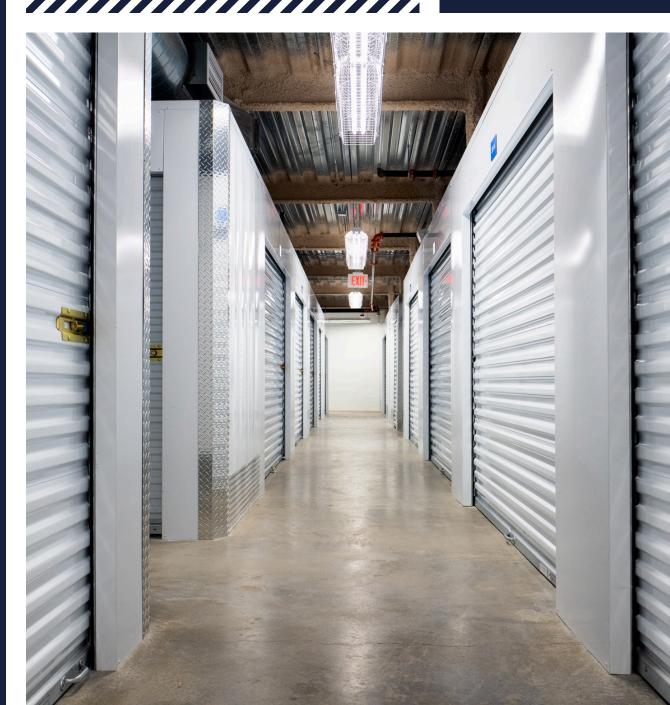
Storage

Make sure there is ample space in your garage so people can get a clear idea of how much space it really has.





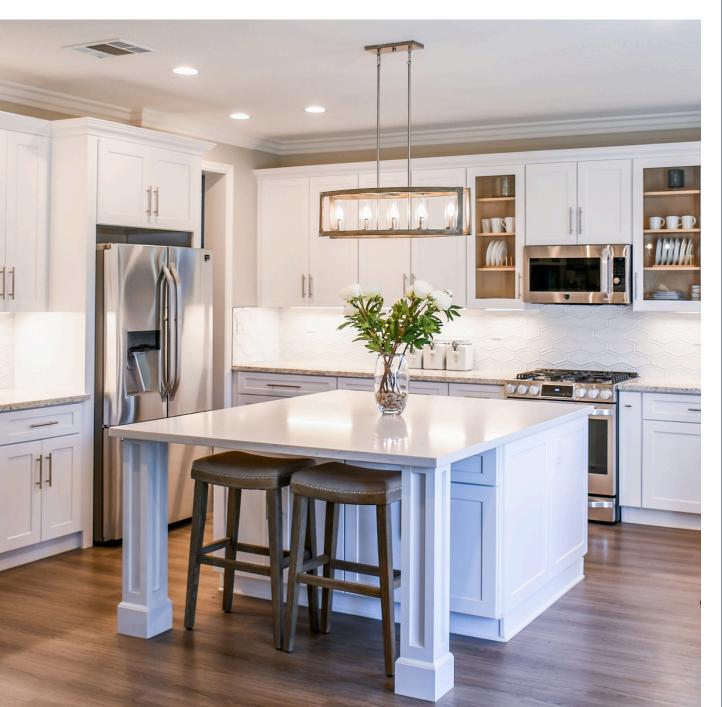

Repairs







Lighting

All lightbulbs should be in proper working condition and a similar hue.

Be sure not to mix different types of light bulb families (cool or warm), because it cheapens the mood, and buyers will take this as a sign of general neglect of the house.

All blinds and window coverings should be open.

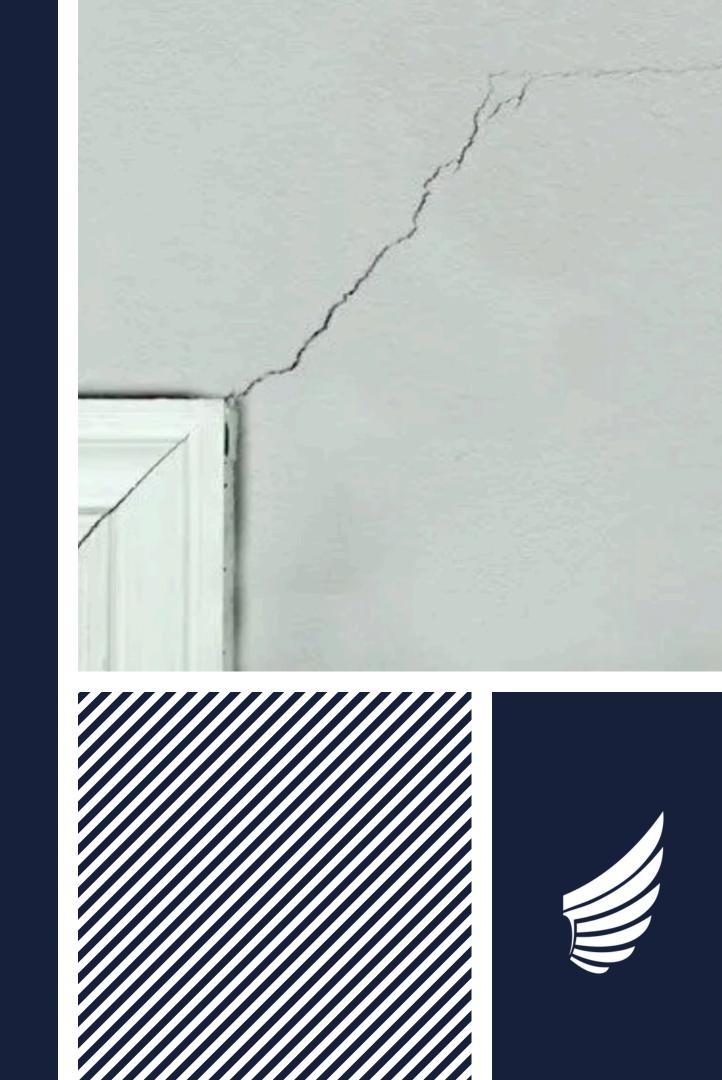
Cracks

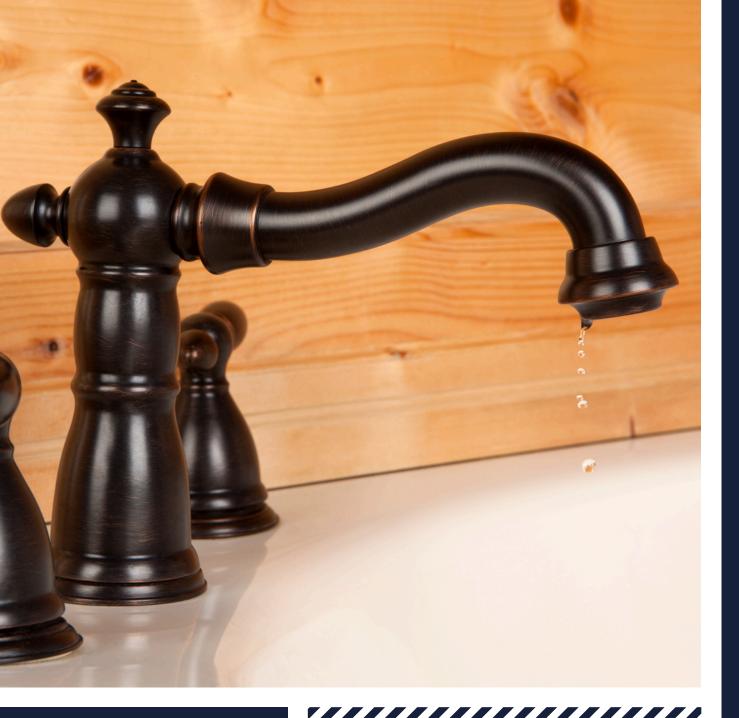
Cracks and holes in the drywall should be repaired as well as the ceilings.

Consider repainting the entire wall instead of just touching up the specific spot. All evidence of repaired water damage should be covered.

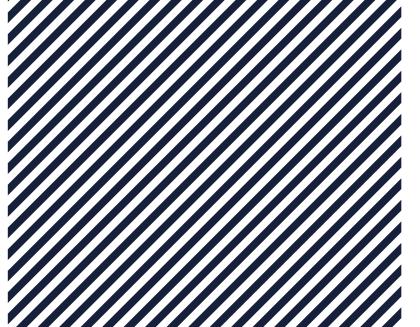
Choose a neutral color or white as opposed to bright and dark colors.

Replace all missing trim.









Drips

Leaky faucets should be fixed, especially if your home will be vacant, because the hard Florida water will ruin the sink.

Be sure to check outside hose spigots, even if they're small drips.

Eliminate Squeaks & Balance Usable Fixtures

A little WD-40 goes a long way! Make all door squeaks are eliminated.

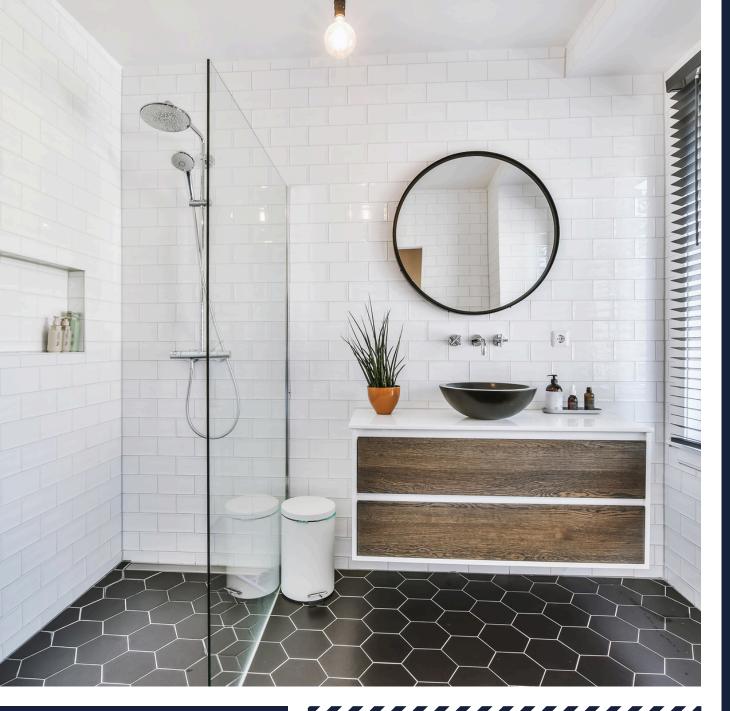
Align cabinet doors and drawers and closet doors to make sure they function properly. Buyers viewing your home will open and close them!

Make It Sparkle

Deep clean your home, especially in the kitchen and the bathrooms.

Polish all metals in the bathroom, re-caulk around the tub and sink.

Remove all fingerprints from all mirrors and glass.

Your house should "feel" clean.

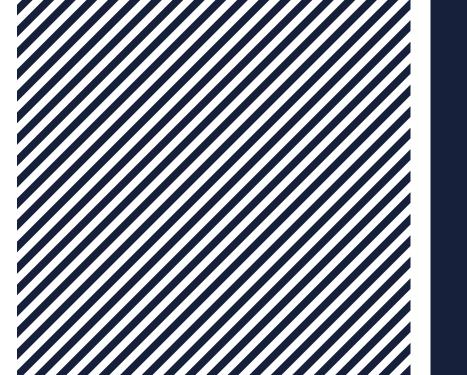
Bedrooms

Beds should be made and tidy.

Items stored under the bed should not stick out.

If bedding is worn out, purchase something new and neutral.

Decorations should not distract from the house.













Dusting

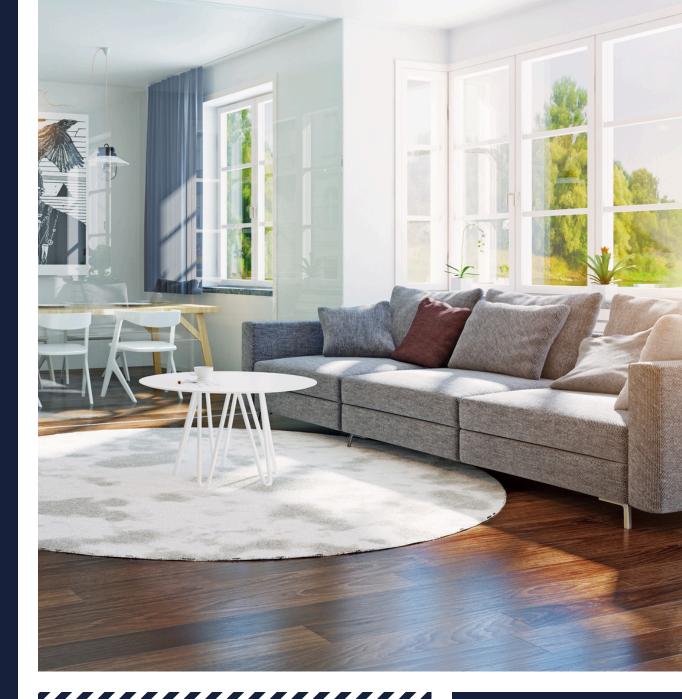
Everything should be dusted from the crown to the baseboard.

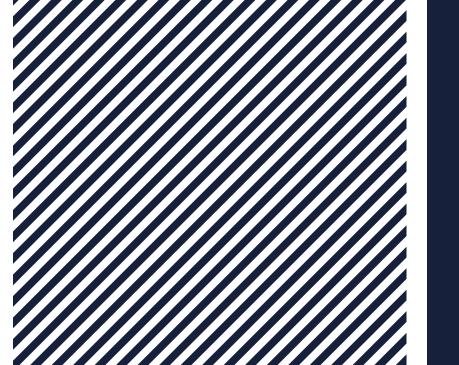
All ceiling fans, light fixtures, furniture and floors underneath the furniture should be cleaned.

Flooring

Carpets should be cleaned, and wood floors should be waxed.

Consistently stay on top of sweeping, mopping, and vacuuming.

Outside Sprucing



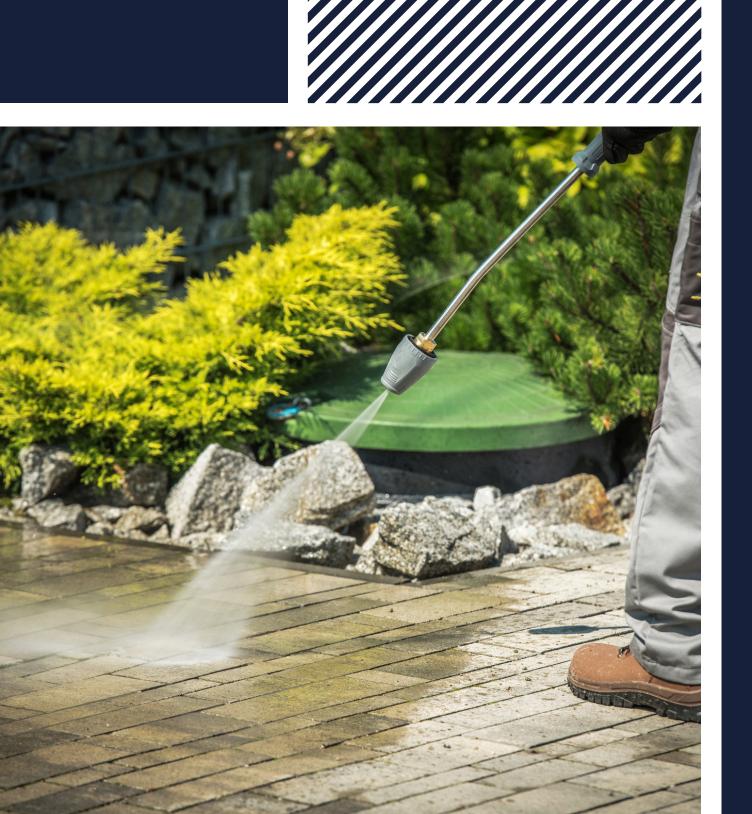
Landscaping

Dig out your sprinklers and make sure that your irrigation is properly functioning.





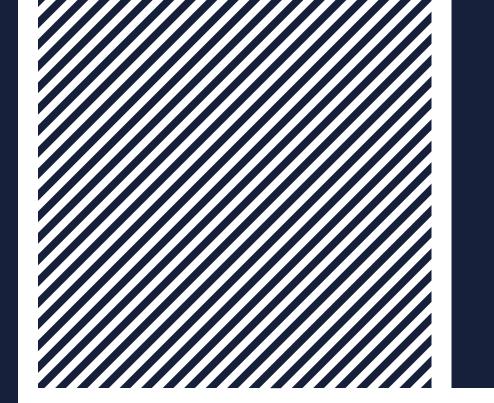
Exterior Surfaces

Make sure your home is pressurewashed, the windows are clean and all decks, lanais and driveways are cleaned and debris-free.

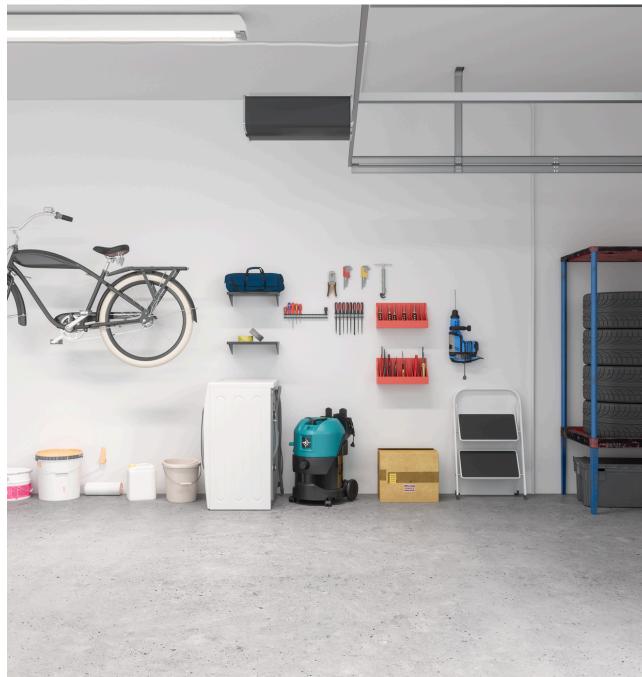
Tidy Up
